## World Age Games 2007

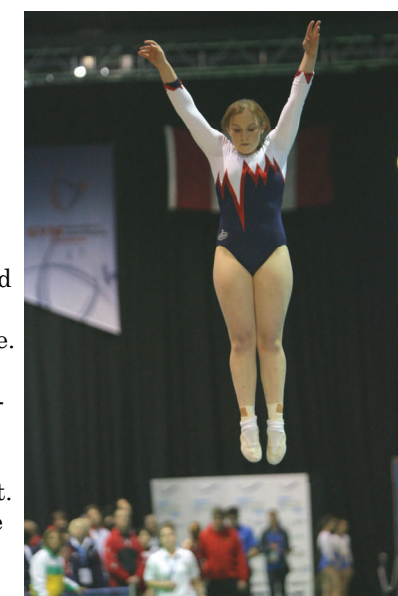

## World Age Group Championships

Emma Britton competed in the 13/14 age group and competed her new 9.6 tariff vol and made the final in 5<sup>th</sup> place out of a group of 63 (top 6 in WAGC final). She then went on to compete in the synchronised event with Nicole Short (City of Liverpool). They scored 43.00 and went into the final in 1<sup>st</sup> place. 10 hours after warming up for her individual, Emma competed her individual final and finished the event in 6<sup>th</sup> place. The synchro was a close final, and after putting in a strong routine Emma and Nicole finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Emma was the only British gymnast to make 2 finals at the championships.

## Elite T.C. Earns Success Abroad and at Home

Elite T.C. traveled to the Algarve in Portugal to compete in the Loulé Cup at the Principal Municipal in the Town of Loulé just outside of Villamoura. The team traveled out on the 25th September for the six day event. Peter Gledhill, Head Coach and a veteran at international competitions, was shocked at the quality of performers there. "I assumed it would be a low level friendly international and was quite taken aback to see live Portuguese TV present, two Olympians and a handful of World Champions present, with the World Championship coming up in November in Quebec Canada, (which Elite has one member going and one in reserve) this seemed to be a prime competition for those getting ready to go.

The competition started on the 28th September with sets and vols. In the Individual Section of Trampolining Paula Caney finished a respectable 16th in the OPEN ladies group and completed her first ever competitive double for her club. Simon Chick finished 11th with Jordan Chung and Glenn Lille in 16th and 17th in the OPEN men's group. In the under 13 group Alice Eveleigh finished a splendid routine to finish 37th from 48, an impressive result as Alice is still working towards national standards in the UK. Finally in the under 13 boys group, Tom Pringle came 16th finishing in the top half of the table, like Alice another competitor working towards national level in UK. Callum Murfet showed great control and displayed good form to finish 4th on the first day of competition and guarantee a place in the finals on the 29th. Callum worked hard on his voluntary and gained a place on the podium in 3rd winning bronze for his club and country.

After the individuals came the Synchro groups. Tom Pringle and Callum Murfet suffered from a shakey start in the sets but managed to place in the top 8 and a place in the finals, where on the 29th they performed their best synchro and gained two places finishing 6th. In the Open Female group, Kate Bramall and Paula Caney showed a good bond of team work and finished 5th on the first day booking a place in the finals. After a small mistake in the finals the ladies finished 6th. In the Men's group, Simon Chick and Glenn Lillie came in 7th booking a place in the finals and displayed a good high level finals routine to gain a place and finish in 6th. Chloe Summerill and Alice Eveleigh showed a good routine just missing out on finals in 9th place.

The final event of the Loulé Cup was Double-Mini Trampoline. In the Junior male group Ed Hookaway finished 26th, an impressive display as this was his first ever competition! In the under 13 female group, Alice Eveleigh finished 17th and in the top half of her group. In the senior men's group, Glenn Lillie finished 16th with Simon Chick in 12th, while Jordan Chung missed out on finals by 0.3 and placed 9th with two very impressive passes. In the under 13 boys group, Tom Pringle finished 14th and Callum Murfet in 7th guaranteeing his third finals. On the day of the finals he pulled up one place finishing 6th. Finally in the open Ladies event, Susannah Morcorwitz finished 20th after a small error but still managed to complete her first ever double somersault pass, Carrie-Ann Williamson finished 11th with a show of good control, Coreen John completed two passes both with doubles and placed 8th in the finals, while Kate Bramall, who has secured a place to Canada later this year to represent Great Britain, completed her two passes finishing 5th. In the finals Coreen showed her passion and determination completing her first ever double, double, with a slight error in her pass. She finished 8th but with a lot of hope for her future showing. Kate Bramall showed intelligence and composure to complete her final 2 passes securing 5th place.

Peter Gledhill Head, Coach of Elite, was overjoyed at the final results with 7 finalists and one individual medal. He did not expect so much from them and, with the added pressure of TV Cameras, was very proud of how all his performers held up. Amy Beales injured herself in training fracturing her little finger but still supported her team mates throughout the competition.

With only a couple of days rest from returning to Portugal, Peter Gledhill headed out Belfast on the 6th October for the Northern Ireland Grade 2 National competition at the Falls Leisure Centre. Frankie Osbourne showed her true grace finishing 4th and qualifying to compete in the Grade 2 National finals later this year in Hull. William Folwell finished 8th but completed his first ever competitive double much to the pride of his coach. Callum Murfet, still on a high from his trip to Portugal, displayed all he had, easily finishing 1st above all his competitors and qualifying for the Grade 2 national finals. Chloe Summerill followed the day's trend and easily qualified to Grade One in the Validation group securing a place in trampolining's Elite next year.

With hardly any time to spare Peter Gledhill then traveled to Heathrow on 7th for the Graded competition at Harlington sports centre. Ryan Hek u15b Grade 4 finished 1st, Emily Brady u15g Grade 4 finished 3rd, Joe Bolger 1st and Jack Duggan 3rd in u17b Grade 4. Jessica McElnduff just missed a medal finishing 4th in the o17g Grade 4. Ayo Ayeni finished 2nd in the o17b Grade 4, Lauren Letch finished 3rd in the u15g Grade 3 section whilst Susannah Morcowitz finished 3rd and secured team gold with her team mate Sarah Pearcey and Paula Naman in the o17 Grade 3 group. Charlotte Savage showed good form winning gold in the u9 elementary group. Alice Eveleigh, still hyped by Portugal, took all she had winning gold in her group and qualifying for Grade 3 in the u13G grade 4 group. In hot pursuit, Tom Pringle replied in kind, grabbing gold and also qualifying for Grade 3.

Peter Gledhill said " After so many competitions in such a short time period we are all tired but the work has paid off and once again Elite has proved they are one of the strongest clubs in the whole region. I am so proud of all our team members and would also like to thank all those that help coach and judge for the club which makes it possible for us to go to these competitions. If it wasn't for the parents being so supportive and showing that being a family is just as important as being a club, we would not be where we are today."
